Exciting Master Class Planned for 2005 Festival

David Harris, Director of the Raleigh Ringers, will lead a Master Class in Bronze level ringing at the 2005 Area II Festival. Plan now for an exciting musical experience of ringing at the highest level.

Ringers in this track will be expected to have experience ringing in choirs that regularly play music at level 5 and 6. The selected repertoire is difficult and ringers must arrive at the festival with the music prepared, ready for fine-tuning by the conductor.

Register early since there will be places for only 28 ringers in the Master Class, consisting of two full choirs including those who will play the lowest bells and chimes. Each ringer must purchase the music for the class (see list below) and arrive with the music prepared for the first rehearsal of the Master Class.

The Master Class track will be scheduled so that all ringers may also play with their "home" choirs as well as participating in the Master Class.

The Master Class will present several pieces at the Festival Concert. Music for the Master Class is as follows:

David M. Harris has been the director of the Raleigh Ringers since January, 1990. He was instrumental in the formation of the group. He was previously director of the handbell program at Hudson Memorial Presbyterian Church and has studied conducting privately with Dr. William A. Payn of Bucknell University. He has served AGEHR as North Carolina State Chairman and as Area III Treasurer. David led in developing Pinnacle 2000, the first national event for community/professional handbell choirs.

Do You Know??

Are you aware of the many grants and scholarships Area II has to offer? We have Betty B. Garee Scholarships for first time attendees to Area Festivals and Seminars as well as National Directors' Seminars. We have the Charlie Cramer Scholarships for non-ringing "roadies" who help to move all your bells and equipment.

We have Mission Grant monies, offered in festival conference years, to help supplement your present sets of handbells or handchimes, or to get you started buying them. Area II offers grant monies (up to \$250) to sub-areas who are trying to get an annual workshop and/

Williamsport Handbell Workshop

A Level I & II workshop for District 13 ringers and directors was held on September 25th in Willia msport, PA at Saint John's-Newberry United Methodist Church. This was the result of a process that began over two years ago. A t that time, I became a District Coordinator with the main goal of helping to bring Area II events to north -central Pennsylvania. Early contacts with District 13 members helped me to assess the needs and goals of interested directors and ringers. Of part icular interest was an event geared to beginning ringers of all ages and volunteer directors. The result was our one -day workshop in September.

Kathie Bittenbender (Area II Chair-Elect) and Pam Spirko (NY State Representative) agreed to be our clinicians, much to my delight! Both of these women had to travel several hours to get to Williamsport, but both came and gave us their time and experience. I considered it a privilege for District 13 ringers to experience the skills and classes that I had experienced with K athie and Pam at the 2002 Read & Ring Seminar in Lancaster. Our workshop consisted of class sessions in handbell techniques, change-ringing, rhythm games, and a directors' round-table discussion, plus a massed-ringing session that rehearsed several songs for the church year and an anthem scheduled for the 2005 Young Ringer's Festival at Bucknell University. Everyone present learned something new about playing or directing handbells, and many had favorable comments about the workshop. B ecause of the workshop, my own choirs are now interested in attending the Bucknell Festival (s), and doing the fund -raising necessary to achieve such a goal.

We are blessed to receive a grant from Area II, which made the workshop possible. Area II Board m embers maintained contact with me and guided me through the application process and follow -up reports. These individuals work diligently and give a lot of their time to provide many benefits for Area II members. I have enjoyed getting to know these people through the process of coordinating our workshop and attending AGEHR and Area II activities. My appreciation and gratitude are extended to all of the Board members for their efforts, and to the AGEHR national office for its endoresement.

As a District Coordinator, I was disappointed that so few District 13 members and area churches appeared to be interested in the workshop. Of the 25 or so District members, only 5 responded to requests in the previous year concerning needs and goals (to be addressed by the workshop), and only 4 actually attended the workshop. Of the 38 workshop participants, only 6 churches—and no academic institutions—were represented. Two churches brought entire choirs, and ages ranged from 5th graders to senior citizens. A future workshop or festival for intermediate choirs might meet the goals of District 13 members better than a Level I & II workshop, but these goals can be met by attending the festivals in State College (Nitanny Valley Fest ival) and Lewisburg (Bucknell Festival). For level I & II ringers, our workshop provided an educational experience and a growth opportunity, and I am thankful to Area II Board members, the workshop committee members, and the national office for help in accomplishing this goal.

AREA II's Mentoring Program provides help for new bell choirs

When bells are purchased through one of the bell manufacturers a gift membership to AGEHR is also included. As part of that first year membership Area II offers a free orientation/getting started workshop to the organization, in order to get the choir started.

Since October of 2003, there have been 3 orientation workshops for new choirs. The workshop is a full-day session provided free to the new choir by an Area II clinician and covers basic ringing techniques and reading handbell music. The choir should be able to play several selections at the end of the session. The clinician will return to work with the choir again at the choir's expense. There are two more workshops of this type scheduled in November in Islip Terrace, NY and Jacobus, PA.

Additionally, Area II's mentoring program will provide a clinician for a choir that wants some additional help to look and sound better or needs some special assistance in reading and playing complicated rhythms. A clinician in the vicinity of the group requesting help will be assigned and those expenses will be paid by the group. This year 1 workshop of this type has already happened and another is scheduled in November.

The third way Area II provides assistance is to individual directors. This assistance is through special workshops for beginning directors or by providing individual assistance with specific issues.
