## Message from the Chair

As I write this, the wind is howling and it is bitterly cold. I have just returned from our February Board meeting in State College, PA where we woke up Saturday to a winter wonderland...and slick roads! It does indeed seem that there will be six more weeks of winter! While spring is not yet here, the Board is busy planning for some exciting events to be held once warmer weather arrives.

While the focus of this meeting was to select music for the 2009 Festival Conference, we also heard details of upcoming events for 2008 including Spring Reading Repertoire Workshops and the Summer Read and Ring.

Locations for the Spring Reading Repertoire workshops were announced. These reading sessions will be held at a number of sites throughout the area in March and April. These events are designed to provide directors and ringers with an opportunity to ring through 20 or so pieces of music of varying levels that might be considered for your choirs. Many thanks to those who have volunteered to host one of these workshops.

A variety of classes were finalized for the upcoming summer "Read and Ring". Remember that this event is designed for individual ringers (although full choirs are most welcome) so be sure to let all your ringers know about this wonderful opportunity to ring under and learn from nationally known directors and from each other. More details on all these events are elsewhere in this newsletter.

The Board is also planning some exciting NEW ventures over the next two years. In 2009, there will be a "Rookie Track" for new and inexperienced choirs who have never attended a festival before. Perhaps your choir feels they are not yet "ready" for a large massed choir experience, or perhaps there is too much music to learn or the music is too difficult. These Rookie Choirs will meet separately from the other festival choirs, ringing music chosen especially for less experienced choirs. In 2010, we plan to provide a 2-day event similar to our adult Read and Ring but designed specifically for youth.

We also welcomed Bobbi Schmid to the Board as our new Mentoring Chair. Bobbi is the one to contact if you are looking for an orientation or mentoring workshop for your choir or several choirs in your area. Her contact information is on the Board list in this letter.

Your Board is working hard to provide events that will be fun and informative for all the ringers and directors in our area. If you have ideas for events that will serve a need in your local area, please be in touch with us.

I'm hoping to meet many of you at this summer's Read and Ring in Split Rock, so if you haven't sent in your registration yet, make it a priority to get it done soon!

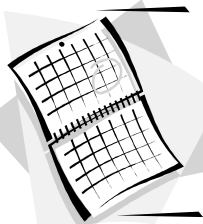
## Noteworthy Articles Needed

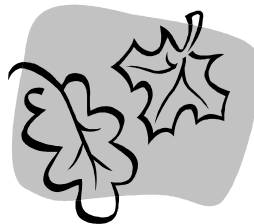

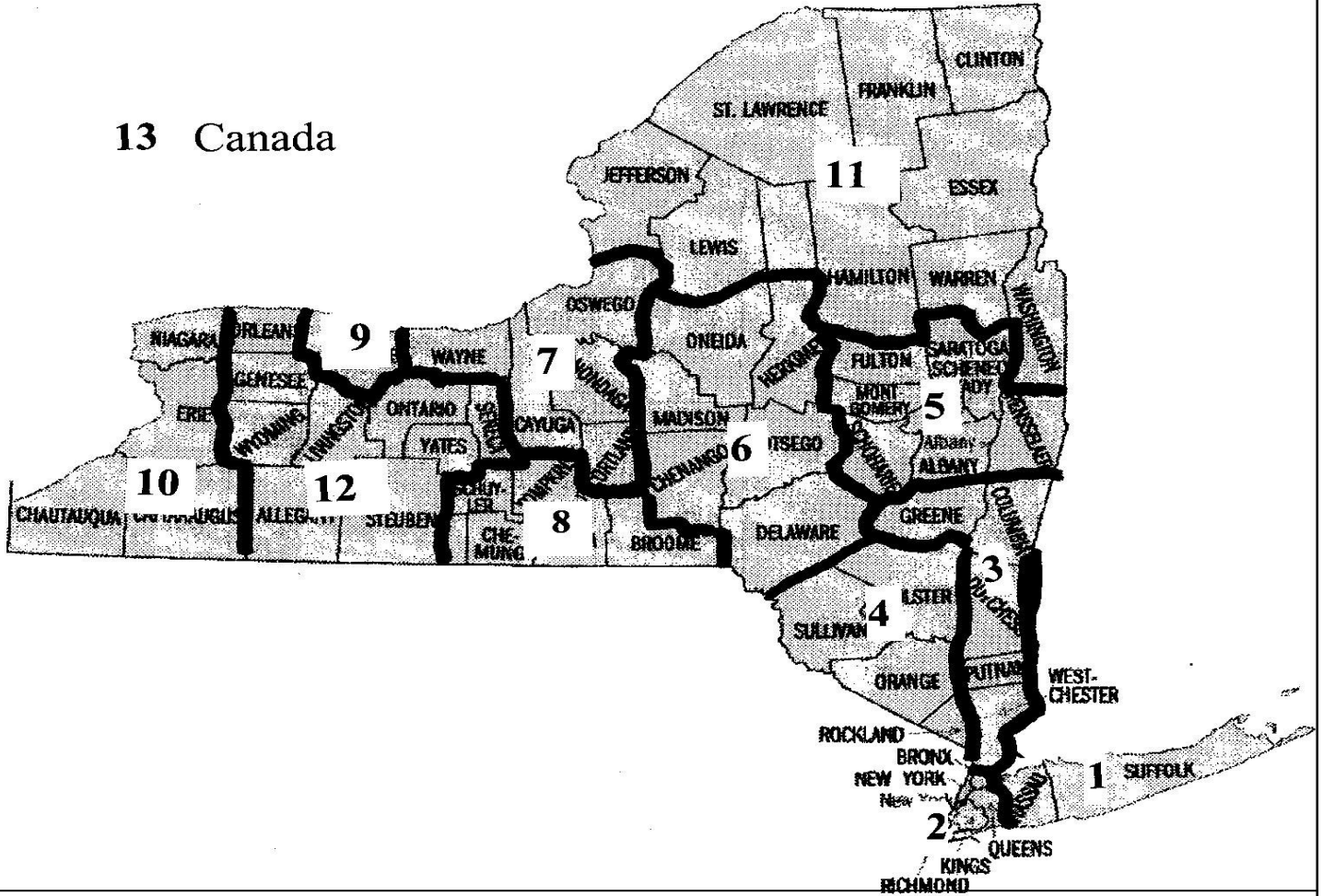

## Come See the Nittany Valley Handbell Festival

The Nittany Valley Handbell Festival is scheduled for Saturday, April 5, 2008 at the gymnasium of the State College Area High School. Our clinician and conductor is going to be Tim Waugh, of Bluefield, West Virginia. Tim is such a popular clinician it is really hard to schedule him, so we are happy he is able to come to Nittany Valley. He is a school teacher and has great methods of working with ringers to produce a very musical result. He was also the clinician at the Area II festival in Oswego, NY this past summer. Tim is an accomplished composer and we plan to use some of his music. As usual, our format is rehearsal from 9 - 5 and a concert for the public in the evening at 7:30. Many choirs can do this in one day. Some like to come in Friday evening and set up their tables and covers and get a little extra sleep on Saturday morning! We always get a special rate on rooms at the Ramada Inn for those who like to spend the night. Registration for this event has been filled, but if you're in the area stop by and see the concert.

### NEW BELL CHOIRS!

Take advantage of Area II's half-day **Orientation/Getting Started Workshop**. It is offered **free of charge** to any choir who has recently purchased a set of bells and to chime-lending program participants. Area II provides the clinician who will arrange a time convenient for you and your ringers; they will come to your facility, and work directly with your ringers on ringing basics, bell changes and special techniques. We have a list of qualified clinicians and we guarantee both you and your ringers will benefit.

### NEW RINGERS OR RINGERS IN NEED OF A TUNE-UP!

Area II also offers a half-day or full day **Mentoring Workshop** for a reasonable fee for all choirs who would like to brush up on their skills and techniques. You decide what your choir needs most and we will send a clinician to work

with your group on those specific needs. We have mentoring workshops available for elementary school chime choirs, school handbell choirs, churches who have found bells in their closet but aren't sure what to do with them, multiple choirs who want to combine their forces for a workshop, and workshops for ringers who would just like to hone their skills on bass techniques, stopped techniques, weaving, or Shelley and 4-in-hand ringing.

Since October 2007 we have held 4 Orientation Workshops and 1 Mentoring Workshop. There are 4 Orientation Workshops pending -waiting for dates and 2 Mentoring workshops pending waiting for a scheduling time.

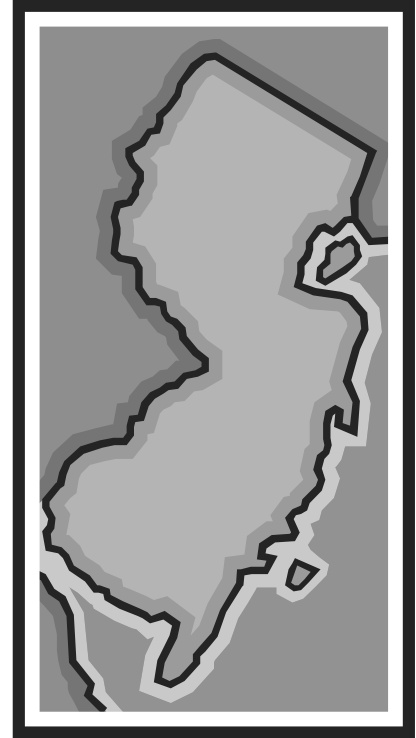

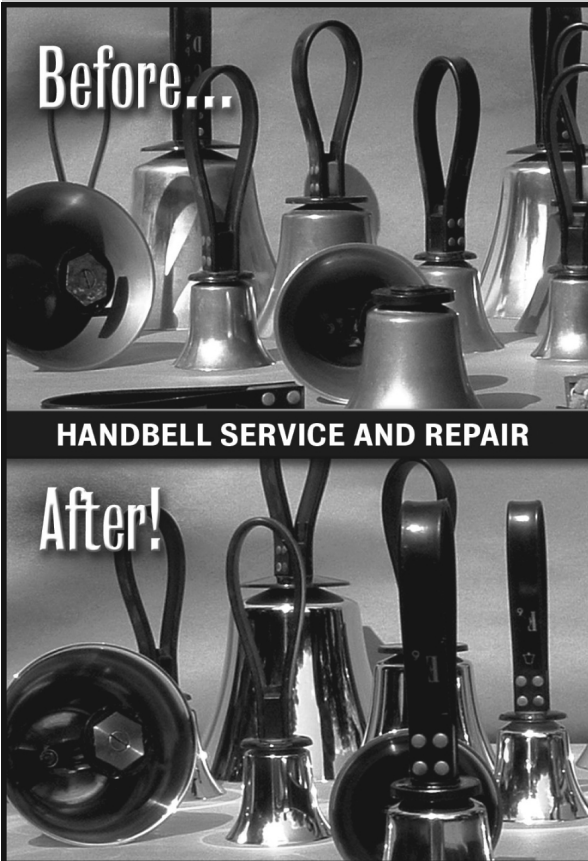

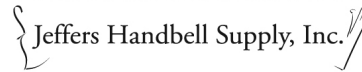

## The Little Engine That Could

A train whistle would soon be heard in the distance as the school was opened to ready us for the inaugural Oil Region Handbell Festival. Eight choirs gathered Saturday, October 20, 2007 at the Titusville, PA Middle School for a day full of rehearsals and workshops. The opening bell was rung by **Amy Keffaber**, Director of The Presbyterian Church Memorial Bell Choir, Titusville. **Sue Garton**, renowned solo ringer from Grove City led a **Treble Bell workshop** while **Corey Winton**, a former Raleigh Ringer, traveled home to Titusville to lead the **Bass Bell workshop**. The large group was divided into Division A and Division B. One comment about the workshops was, "Wow! I thought I knew everything there was to know about ringing a bell until that class!"

Division A spent time in rehearsal with massed guest director, **Howard Moser**, Past Area II Chairman, Glenshaw, PA.. Kevin McChesney's "Joyful Rhythm" and Anna Laura Page's "Bell Jubilee" with Titusville's own **Kevin Vinson** accompanied the handbells on flute. Division B came together with Arnold Sherman's "Gracioso" and "The Virgin Mary Had A Baby Boy" by Jeffrey Honore.

The afternoon provided additional workshops and rehearsals. **Marilyn Hines**, Past Area II Chair and National Chair, hosted a **Maori Sticks workshop** while **Corey Winton** provided the **Cup Game**. After a full day, a chicken dinner buffet was catered by **Gionti's Catering** of Titusville. Each Choir Director in attendance was given a souvenir bottle of crude oil from **Drake Well Museum**. Several other prizes were awarded during the dinner. Following dinner everyone went back into the gym for a final run through including

entertainment from **Sue Garton** as she played Simple Gifts and her rendition of The Twelve Days of Christmas. **Echoes of Praise children's handbell Choir of First United Methodist Church, Titusville** accompanied Sue on boomwackers while the festival participants sang the little song.

The 7:00 p.m. public concert featured each division, **Sue Garton**, and we came together for a massed event of "Alleluia Amen" - Linda R. Lamb, "Make Me an Instrument of Thy Peace" - Kevin McChesney. **Jackie Wagner of First Presbyterian Church, Titusville**, recited the narration while **Kevin Vinson** played trumpet, **Jane Bradshaw**, clarinet, and **Amy Keffaber**, accompanied the group on tympani. The final massed piece, "Gospel Train", Valerie Stephenson, was a visual sight with Howard 'Cecil B. De-' Moser as the conductor. (During final practice the train again came by the school blowing the train whistle!)

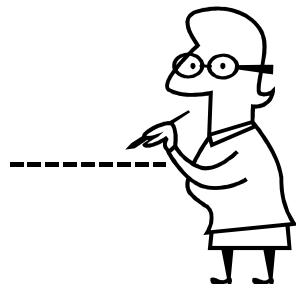
